The Priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each candidate with holy Oil for Baptism

and remain faithful to Christ
to the end of your life.

The Water of Baptism: the candidate and their family move to the font We praise you, loving Father, for the gift of your Son Jesus.

He was baptised in the River Jordan, where your Spirit came upon him and revealed him as the Son you love.

He sent his followers to baptise all who turn to him.

Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water, that those who are baptised in it may be cleansed in the water of life, and, filled with your Spirit, may know that they are loved as your children, safe in Christ for ever. **Amen.**

The Profession of Faith

Let us affirm, together with these who are being baptised, our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again? I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world?

Early in the morning, as the mist lifted from the soil,
Mary Magdalene and Jesus met.

Offertory Hymn

The bread and wine are brought up from the body of the Church. A collection is taken to support the mission of St Paul's. Holy things are censed, including God's holy people.

See, what a morning, gloriously bright, with the dawning of hope in Jerusalem; folded the grave-clothes, tomb filled with light, as the angels announce Christ is risen! See God's salvation plan, wrought in love, borne in pain, paid in sacrifice, fulfilled in Christ, the man, for he lives, Christ is risen from the dead!

See Mary weeping, 'Where is he laid?' as in sorrow she turns from the empty tomb; hears a voice speaking, calling her name; it's the Master, the Lord raised to life again! The voice that spans the years, speaking life, stirring hope, bringing peace to us, will sound till he appears, for he lives, Christ is risen from the dead!

One with the Father, Ancient of Days, through the Spirit who clothes faith with confidence, honour and blessing, glory and praise to the King crown'd with power and authority! And we are raised with him, death is dead, love has won, Christ has conquered; and we shall reign with him, for he lives, Christ is risen from the dead!

The Preparation of the Altar [We stand]
